REVIEWING YOUR SMART GOALS

It is always better to make periodic corrections, rather than continue blindly to the end. Failure to evaluate along the way, could leave you very disheartened at the end.

MAY 2024 Title: Bible Guidelines for the Family

God places everyone in a family as a gift to that family. A family unit might consist of a couple; a mother, father and children; a single parent and child; grandparents and grandchildren; aunts and uncles; a sibling group; cousins or adopted relatives. God is interested in everyone who lives in the family. He has given many guidelines in the Holy Bible about how families should live.


One of the things which God desires is that each family worships Him at home. This should help family members to be joyful and united. Family members who worship at home will become strong in the Lord and in their relationships with each other.

It is also important for each family to meet with other families to worship God together. Here are some names of places where people meet regularly for worship: church building, chapel, temple, cathedral, assembly hall, tent and mission house. God is pleased when families meet to worship Him, whether it is in large or small gatherings. He accepts their sincere worship, in spite of the place, and blesses the families that worship together.

Through the Bible stories, songs and activities in the month of **May**, you will learn that you are important to your family and that your family is important to you.

God is great, powerful and holy. In a vision, Isaiah saw God sitting on a very high throne. A host of angels, called Seraphim, surrounded the throne. They were worshipping God. They said, Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of His glory (Isaiah 6:3 NIV). God truly deserves the reverence and worship of all human beings, as well as angels.

Worshipping together is perhaps the most important thing that a family can do. Christian homes should be like a Christian church in which every member of the household shares in reverence in God's presence, earnest prayer, songs of praise and learning from God's Word, the Bible.

Families which love God obey what He tells them to do. He tells us to study His Word (Deuteronomy 6:6-9). We should study His Word because

it is the foundation of life and God wants it to remain in our mind every day of our life.

Family worship allows all of the household, together offer to themselves to God acceptance, blessings and leading. It shows that they want to walk before Him in obedience, fear and love. The Bible has examples of heads of families who ensured that the family remained fixed on God in worship. Joshua was one example. He said, ... Choose for yourselves this day whom you will serve,... But as for me and my household, we will serve the LORD (Joshua 24:15) NIV.

Family worship can encourage peace in the home and help to bind the family together. The household will realize that no matter what else they do, the most important thing that marks them as a family is that they are one unit in God's sight.

That bond strengthens the family when it face difficulties such as sickness and sadness.

We read in Psalm 34:15 NIV: The eyes of the LORD are upon the righteous, and his ears open unto their cry. From this we learn that God hears when families call on Him in prayer and He shows great mercy and favour to families which are righteous. According to verses 17 and 19 also, though godly families may meet with trouble, when they cry, the LORD heareth and delivers them out of all their troubles. Family worship is a command, a duty and a privilege which no family should neglect.



The Bible places much emphasis on the role and responsibilities of a woman who fears God and looks about the well-being of her family. In the typical home, the mother, or other female head, has many roles. She is not only wife and mother; she is often disciplinarian, nurturer, teacher, nurse, cook, driver, housekeeper, homework supervisor, cleaner and washer. You can list many other roles. Her extremely busy hours are noted in Proverbs 31 verse 15. She begins her mammoth tasks towards her family's comfort early in the morning.

The godly mother is keen about her family's clothing. She makes or buys beautiful clothing for the members of her household (v.21), and she herself is beautifully dressed (v. 22). Along with the lovely appearance, the mother wants her family members to have confidence in themselves so she never forgets to build their self-esteem by encouraging them. The text also shows the following characteristics of the godly mother: businesslike, kind, dignified, wise, attentive and strong.

Many women do good things, but the godly mother is outstanding in her giving up of self completely for the good of her entire family. She does not stay among those who are idle, as she is always busy with the affairs of her household. The writer praises the mother for her work and worth (vv. 10, 28, 29).

Have you noticed that although a mother works so hard, she does not usually ask for anything in return? Her dedication to the many duties and to her family comes out of her desire to please God (v.30). She understands that she needs to worship God and depend on Him to guide her as she plays

her role in the family. Her household knows that God comes first in her life. Sometimes, she is the one who leads the family in Bible study and devotion.

As family members, we should never take our mother for granted. We should encourage her by commending her for the good qualities we see in her, and let her know that we see how God is using her to bless our life. The entire family should pray for and with her, as together the family seeks to build their relationship with God.

In some homes, the person who plays the role of mother is a grandmother, aunt, sister, other relative, foster mother or friend of the family. We should accept and respect them, too, as the guardians or caregivers chosen by God and placed by Him in our families.

A woman who fears the Lord is to be praised. Honour her for all that her hands have done, and let her works bring her praise at the city gate. (Proverbs 31:30b-31 NIV)


